## Hospital Update - Summary of 2022

We are so grateful for the committed fundraising and generosity St John Eye Hospital has received from all of our dedicated supporters. You make a huge difference to the work we can do and the number of patients we can reach.

In 2022, we were delighted to celebrate our 140<sup>th</sup> anniversary of providing charitable eye care in the Holy Land, which initially began in 1882 to treat a prevalent and blinding corneal eye disease. 140 years later - the Hospital now operates across five different sites, treating more than 140,000 patients and performing over 6,500 surgeries per year. Our celebrations began in June with the launch of our new book about the Hospitals' history: 'A Beacon of Hope: 140 years of Eye Care in the Holy Land, 1882-2022', written by Matthew Glozier, Ian Howie-Willis and John Pearn. This fascinating read is now available for purchase in paperback (RRP £36) from our website or through sending a cheque to the office at: 4 Charterhouse Mews, London, EC1M 6BB.

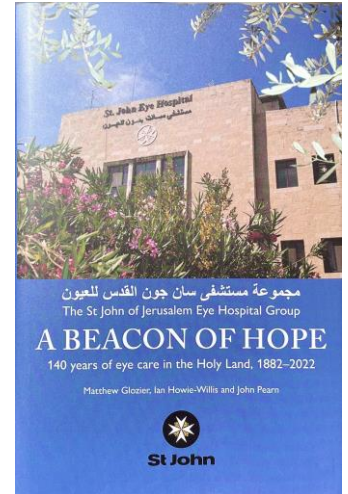

Our highlights of 2022 include: the re-opening of our School of Nursing; achieving JCI Gold Accreditation for our Jerusalem Hospital; and forming a training partnership with the UNRWA. Establishing a second outreach team; the opening of Kufor Aquab Clinic; launching a neonatal retinopathy of prematurity screening initiative as well as the increase in the number of surgical sessions in Gaza by 50%, are all major clinical achievements this year.

We are proud to say that, in 2022, the number of outpatients seen at St John Eye Hospital Group reached **142,876**, compared to 134,000 in 2021 – an increase of 8,876 patients. Furthermore, the Group achieved a new record as we performed **6,916** major eye surgeries, compared to our 2021 record of 6,500 major surgeries. We are incredibly proud of the hard work of all our staff and thankful to our generous donors who enabled us to treat so many patients.



## Hospital Update Continued...

In 2022, we established a second outreach service in the West Bank; outfitted with a new, fully equipped mobile outreach van. The primary focus of the team is to screen patients from refugee camps and isolated communities, and we expect our outreach teams to treat 20,000 patients every year.

In total, 8,047 patients were treated by the two outreach teams, between January and October 2022, in addition to almost 5,000 patients seen at the Kufor Aqab outreach clinic. Our outreach work in Gaza has remained uninterrupted and continues to focus on treating patients with disabilities, women, and the elderly. In total, 5,157 patients were treated by the outreach team in Gaza in 2022.

At the end of December 2022, our staff enjoyed a well-earned Christmas Lunch the Jerusalem Hospital, to say thank you for all their hard work over the past year (see left picture).

Each year, it costs approximately £10.9 million to run our services, and we could not fund this without the commitment and generosity of our donors.

With the uncertainties related to the political situation, as well as the downward trend in the number of referrals from the Palestinian Authority, the Hospital will continue to face challenges in the years to come.

Looking to the new year, we hope to continue our high standard of care, making a difference to the lives of thousands of patients.

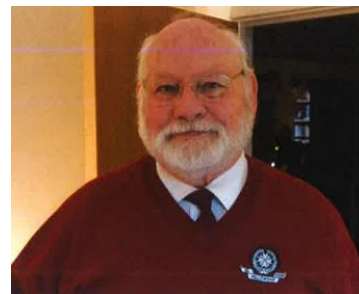
### Huge Congratulations!

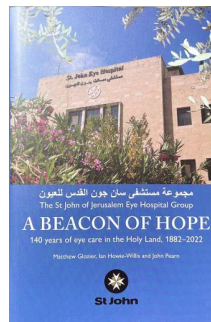

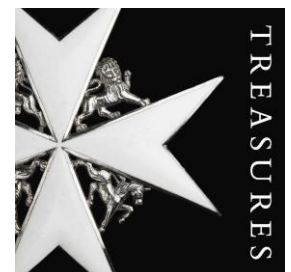
