What are Partnership Boards?

Groups of people coming together to make life better in Ealing for people with support or care needs. The Boards include people who work for social care, education, the NHS, representatives from community groups and, most importantly, people in Ealing with lived experience. The Boards usually meet every three months.

How can I get involved?

You are welcome to come along to a meeting to give your views and ideas, to get more involved, or just to observe and see what you think.

Some of the meetings will be online and some will be in person at community venues.
