BOWEL CANCER AWARENESS MONTH

FOR INFORMATION AND ACTION – ALL PRACTICE STAFF

- Every April, Bowel Cancer Awareness Month gives us a chance to raise awareness about bowel cancer and bowel cancer screening.
- It's a crucial opportunity to educate people about the disease and its symptoms, and to support people affected by bowel cancer.
- NHS England have developed a Bowel Cancer Awareness Communications Toolkit that you can draw from to raise awareness of the importance of bowel screening amongst patients.
- It includes the following:
 - Key messaging
 - o Importance of screening 'Your next poo can save your life'
 - Completing the kit
 - Test results
 - Useful information about the FIT test and how patients can access them (if not received in post)
 - Posters (that can be downloaded) and Digital screen assets to display in reception screens

TEMPORARY PAUSE TO CERVICAL AND BOWEL CANCER SCREENING SMS REMINDERS – ALL PRACTICE STAFF

- iPLATO currently send bowel and cervical cancer screening SMS reminders across London. The iPLATO: NHS London contract comes to an end on 31 March 2024 which will result in a temporary pause to the issue of text messages until new arrangements are in place.
- We hope to resume the service in summer 2024 and will contact you with more detail in due course.

PAN LONDON URGENT SUSPECTED CANCER REFERRAL FORMS – UPDATED ON SYSTMONE

FOR INFORMATION – ALL GPs

- From **1 October 2023**, the standards measuring waiting times for cancer diagnosis and treatment were modernised and simplified.
- This resulted in the removal of the Two Week Wait standard requiring a first appointment within two weeks.
- Work is being undertaken to make minor changes to the Urgent Suspected Cancer referral forms on SystemOne to move away from the whole "2 week wait" pathway – i.e. no longer promoting that patient will hear within 2 weeks (and forms start to make reference to 28 days etc). These will be updated for EMIS practices when the Transforming Cancer Services Team (TCST) releases the updated EMIS forms for replacement.
- There will be a removal of 2WW within the Filename/Folders etc, which may cause confusion when users searching for forms (if not using C the Signs etc, but S1 directly).
