CANCER PREVENTION

HPV VACCINATION FOR CATCH UP COHORTS PATIENTS AGED 14 - 24

FOR INFORMATION AND ACTION - ALL STAFF

- The human papillomavirus (HPV) vaccine helps to prevent HPV infection and HPVrelated cancers and genital warts from developing.
- While most types of HPV are harmless, some high-risk types can lead to the development of cancers, including cervical cancer, cancers of the head and neck (mouth and throat) and cancers of the anus and genital areas.
- General practices are commissioned by NHS England to provide catch-up HPV vaccination to 14- to 24-year olds, where the individual was eligible* under the routine school adolescent programme but missed vaccination.
- GPs receive an item of service fee (£10.06) per dose.
- The type offer specified in the contract is 'opportunistic or if requested' *eligibility includes all girls born after 1 September 1991 and boys born on or after 1 September 2006 https://assets.publishing.service.gov.uk/media/6602c2eef1d3a09b1f32acb4/general-medical-services-statement-of-financial-entitlements-directions-2024.pdf

ACTION FOR PRACTICES:

Practices should consider identifying patients in this cohort for potential vaccination if HPV vaccination is not already indicated in patients' records.

NEW RESOURCES - TAKING PART IN CANCER SCREENING FOR PEOPLE EXPERIENCING HOMELESSNESS ACROSS LONDON

- The four NHS Cancer Alliances in London commissioned Groundswell, a homelessness charity, to develop cancer screening guides for people experiencing homelessness in the capital.
- This was achieved with support from NHS London Region Cancer Screening Commissioning Team. The three guides focus on each of the national cancer screening programmes (bowel, breast and cervical). The guides are tailored for people experiencing homelessness and those who support them. They provide information on what cancer screening is, why it is important, how to take part and what reasonable adjustments are in place to encourage screening participation.





- Print and electronic guides in English are available on the <u>Groundswell resource</u> <u>hub</u> and the <u>Transformation Partners in Health and Care Cancer Screening Directory</u> webpages and will be translated into 15 languages (will be shared once available)
- In addition North Central London Cancer Alliance have also developed some FAQs about screening and the reasonable adjustments available.

TARGETED LUNG HEALTH CHECK PROGRAMME:

WEST LONDON LUNG HEALTH CHECKS PROGRAMME – REVISED GP TOOLKIT AND LAUNCH INTO KENSINGTON AND CHELSEA BOROUGH

- In September 2024, RM Partners North West and South West London Cancer Alliance, began rolling out its lung health check programme into the borough of Kensington and Chelsea (K&C).
- Since we have started the local service **77%** of the lung cancers we have found have been at stage 1 and 2. This contrasts with only **36%** of lung cancers being diagnosed at an early stage through the usual routes to diagnosis that is through Early Suspected Cancer referrals and emergency presentations at A&E departments. The programme is on a path to full roll out with all eligible patients expected to have been invited by 2028.


IMPORTANT INFORMATION PROVIDING PRIMARY CARE WITH:

1. CLARITY ON THE SOFT TISSUE SARCOMA PATHWAY 2. UPDATED REFERRAL FORM

FOR INFORMATION - ALL STAFF

Clarity on the soft tissue sarcoma pathway:

- ALL suspected BONE sarcomas must be referred to the Royal National Orthopaedic Hospital service ONLY.
- The **soft tissue sarcoma** pathway is now delivered through a hub and spoke model.
- The Urgent Suspected Cancer (USC) referral forms have been updated to reflect this change (see below)
- Depending on the clinical findings on initial imaging in primary care patients should be referred to either a hub or diagnostic spoke service. Guidance is provided: <u>https://www.transformationpartners.nhs.uk/usc-sarcoma-clinical-guide/</u>
