
# Step 1 – IDENTIFICATION of individuals aged 6 months and over who are immunosuppressed

Practices should undertake local searches (shared below) within their GP IT systems (i.e. SystmONE or EMIS) to search for patients who are immunosuppressed and draw up a list of those who are eligible using the Green Book definitions (Greenbook chapter 14a).

- Search location



# Step 2 - INVITATION of individuals aged 6 months to 64 years who are in a clinical risk group

Once patient has been identified, practices should contact the individual and invite them to be vaccinated at one of the active sites in NWL. Please note NBS will open to public to book appointments from 25 March 2025 for vaccination from 1 April 2025.

This is the priority group for vaccination and should be contacted immediately. Healthcare teams should use the opportunity to ensure that the child is up to date with their routine vaccinations.

## Vaccination of infants aged 6 months to 4 year olds who are immunosuppressed

(Please note: over 5 year olds can book an appointment via NBS).

### Park Royal Medical Practice in Brent (Saturday only)

For immunosuppressed children aged 6 months to 4 years from a non-Harness PCN practices, the GP or a referring clinician can send the patient details (including name, NHS number, date of birth, and reason for the vaccine) to <a href="mailto:harness.enhancedaccess@nhs.net">harness.enhancedaccess@nhs.net</a> or call on The Single Point of Access (SPA) number: **02081947355** 

Upon receiving the referral, it will be triage and an appropriate appointment will be scheduled for the child.

Site team will also acknowledge the referral email and provide any necessary updates. After administering the vaccine, vaccination details will be entered in Outcomes for Health and the referring GP or clinician will be informed.
