Top Tips for GPs

Recognising that this is a busy time for Child Health with many viral illnesses circulating below are some tools that will help:

- Template on S1 and Emis Found under autoconsult, paediatrics, NWL template. Template has integrated coding, table of normal reference ranges, colour coded to NICE traffic light system and links to safety netting. The phone lines for A&G are included.
- Guidelines Guidelines, resources, patient leaflets for 'top 10' common childhood issues - both physical and mental health, with easy-to-use guidelines, GPs can help by managing these conditions in the community where possible, improving quick access to appropriate investigations for children and increasing GP confidence in when and where to refer. 

Paediatric A&E data trends

A&E attendances remain slightly below the pre-COVID average (Apr-19 to Mar-19) and continue to follow the same pattern as 2022 with a slight rise.

Key Points:

- In week 1, influenza activity decreased across some indicators, including hospital admissions, but increased in others.
- COVID-19 and respiratory syncytial virus (RSV) activity decreased across most indicators.
- FluSurvey continues to show reduced mixing in week 1, which may contribute to decreased transmission of respiratory viruses
- A&E attendances fell below pre-COVID average (Apr-19 to Mar-19)
