For practices who wish to undertake this exercise for either <u>Tortus</u> or <u>Anima</u>, Bordercross Health will develop your DCB0160 at a cost to the practice of just £100

Participation will require you to complete an evaluation form as well This offer does not include procurement or licensing of the Scribes by NWL ICB. Practices are responsible for accessing the tool directly from supplier.

DCB0160 Compliance Support:

DCB0160 is an NHS safety standard that makes sure any IT system used in healthcare is checked and managed properly so it doesn't put patients at risk.

NHSE London is partnering with <u>Bordercross Health</u> to support digital clinical safety compliance for practices. By law, practices must meet clinical safety standards (DCB0160) when introducing digital tools impacting patient care. Ideally, every practice would have a trained Clinical Safety Officer to oversee this, but we acknowledge this is not yet in place for most practices.

*The DCB160 will require the practice to enter the name of a local clinician who will be recorded in the documentation as the practice's clinical lead for the implementation — and has agreed to do so. This individual will act as the point of contact for ICB or other Clinical Safety Officer (CSO) enquiries. The clinician should be a CSO, but where this is not possible, please use a clinician training to be a CSO or with relevant clinical safety and IT experience.

The Bordercross Health tool automates the hardest parts of clinical safety: engaging all the staff in the practice and continuously through each phase of the technology lifecycle. This pilot is a one-off offer only for DCB0160 generation of Scribes. For any future activity beyond the scope of this pilot, practices or PCNs must engage with Bordercross Health as they see fit.

What Bordercross Health offers:

- 1. **Hazard Workshop Survey:** Post freemium approval for Heidi or receipt of £100 payment for Anima / Tortus, a hazard workshop survey link will be sent to your practice. At least four team members (ideally across different roles) should complete the survey.
- 2. **Analysis:** After 2-3 weeks, Bordercross Health will prepare your practice-specific DCB0160 clinical safety documentation for review and approval by NWL ICB and the wider London Clinical Safety team.
- 3. **Delivery:** Once approved and your practice has submitted at least four survey responses:
- You'll receive personalised clinical safety documents
- An implementation guide
- A continuous issue-reporting survey link
- 5. **Local Review & Sign-off:** Review documents at a team meeting. Your designated Clinical Safety Officer (CSO) or local clinical lead* must sign off the documentation.
- 6. **Ongoing Monitoring:** For up to one-year, post-deployment surveys will be issued. These support your ongoing compliance with CQC and DCB0160 standards.

Bordercross Health will keep your practice updated throughout all stages of this process.
