

Measles National

From 1 October 2023, there have been 465 laboratory confirmed measles cases reported in England. 17 cases were reported in October, 42 in November, 161 in December and 240 so far in January 2024 and 4 in February. 7% (32 of 465) in London.

Figure 1. Laboratory confirmed cases of measles by month of onset of rash or symptoms reported, London and England: 1 January 2012 to 13 February 2024 [notes 1 and 2]



From 1 October until 13 February 2024, there have been 521 laboratory confirmed measles cases reported (Figure 2) in England, an increase of 56 cases from 6 February. 17 cases were reported in October, 42 in November, 160 in December 2023, 252 in January and 50 so far in February 2024. 69% (358 of 521) of these cases have been in the West Midlands, 14% (71 of 521) in London and 7% (37 of 521) in Yorkshire and The Humber. The majority (343 of 521, 66%) of these cases have been in children under the age of 10 years and 25% (133 of521) in young people and adults over the age of 15 years. Most cases have been unvaccinated.

Cos of living Support

We know many of our residents are still struggling with the cost of living. It's important to remind patients there is support available. This can include schemes and discounts to help individuals and their families, and those who are disabled or are Severely Mentally Impaired (SMI).

Our cost of living pages act as a 'one-stop-shop' for information about these schemes, as well as local support and advice to help with the cost of living.

The pages now include information about the NHS Healthy Start Scheme. It is designed to help support parents with the costs of buying milk, fruit, vegetables and instant formula, along with other selected items. It is open to parents with children


under the age of four who meet an eligibility criterion. Access our pages here.

Paediatric A&E data trends

A&E attendances remain slightly below the pre-COVID average (Apr-19 to Mar-19) and continue to follow the same pattern as 2022 with a slight rise.

Key Points:

- In week 7, influenza and COVID-19 activity decreased across most indicators.
 Respiratory syncytial virus (RSV) activity was low with indications of further decreases across some indicators.
- A&E attendances have decreased over the last week and are now just below the pre-COVID average (Apr-19 to Mar-19)
