NEW REFERRAL FORM FOR EUROPAC TO IDENTIFY FAMILIAL PANCREATIC CANCERS EARLIER

The European Registry of Hereditary Pancreatic Diseases (EUROPAC) is a national registry study to help with early identification of people at risk of familial pancreatic cancer. Patients that are identified as being high risk are offered participation into registry and may be offered CT surveillance and blood tests if eligible.

This includes those with a family history of pancreatic cancer or pancreatitis, or associated genetic syndromes such as Peutz-Jeghers Syndrome.

IMPROVING CERVICAL SCREENING PARTICIPATION WITH APPT HEALTH

Appt Health, in collaboration with Imperial College London, has been awarded funding through the NHS Cancer Programme Innovation Open Call to implement and evaluate patient-centred approaches to patient engagement with the aim of increasing participation in cervical screening.

RM Partners is one of seven cancer alliances across England that will be involved with this project.

The work combines behavioural science, inclusive co-design and automated patient engagement to better engage patients who are often missed by traditional approaches. The project will look to identify patient preference when receiving screening invitations, either by SMS, letter or telephone.

We are working with Appt Health to invite GP practices with low uptake, high risk populations to participate and use this intervention in 30,000 screening invites across our geography. More information on Appt Health is <u>available here</u>.

RM Partners Cancer Alliance, in collaboration with the North West London ICB Business Intelligence Team, has released a new demonstration video for the NWL WSIC Cervical Cancer Screening Dashboard.

Presented by Narinder Sinclair, RM Partners Cervical Screening Lead at NWL ICB, the video showcases how Primary Care Networks (PCNs) and the Integrated Care System (ICS) can utilise the dashboard to analyse cervical screening data at borough, PCN, and practice levels. This tool supports the identification of unscreened populations, enabling targeted interventions and focused outreach.
