What is the purpose of the study?

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Why have I been invited to take part?

What will I need to do if I take part?

 - Your responses will be treated confidentially, both as a PCN manager and for your organization.
 - All data will be securely stored in line with the General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR).
 - Findings will be published in academic journals or presented at conferences, but no individual participant or organization will be identifiable.
 - Regional differences may be reported, but confidentiality will always be maintained
