We can also help with:

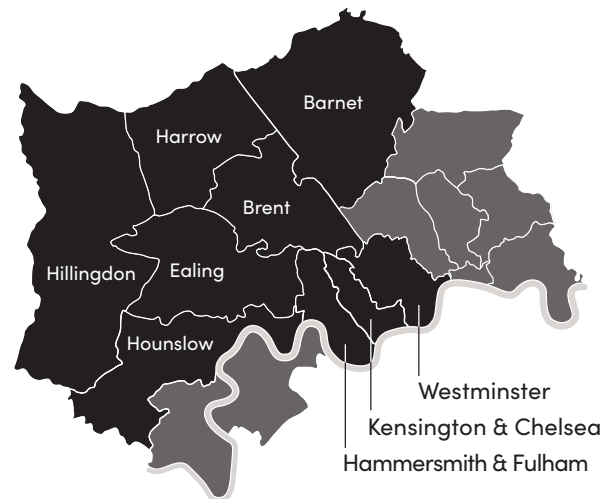
- Benefits advice and support
