# Upcoming Pilot of WID Easy Test in Secondary Care

Dear Colleague,

We are writing to inform you about an upcoming pilot of the WID Easy Test <u>The WID-easy Test | AGHealth</u>, which is due to commence in November 2025 at West Middlesex Hospital.

### What is the WID Easy Test?

The WID Easy Test is a non-invasive, blood-based diagnostic tool designed to support earlier detection of endometrial cancer. It analyses DNA methylation markers associated with malignancy, offering a promising adjunct to current diagnostic pathways. The test has shown potential to improve triage accuracy and reduce unnecessary invasive procedures.

#### How will the pilot work?

Eligible patients referred to secondary care will be triaged and, where appropriate, have a sample collected for WID testing. Once results are available, patients will be contacted directly with their outcome and advised on the next steps in their care pathway.

There is no change to your current referral process. However, we wanted to ensure you are aware of this pilot and its potential benefits for patients.

#### **GP FAQs**

# 1. Do I need to do anything differently when referring patients?

No. Continue to refer patients as usual. Secondary care teams will assess eligibility and manage sample collection and follow-up.

# 2. Which patients are eligible for the WID Easy Test?

Eligibility will be determined by secondary care clinicians based on referral criteria and clinical presentation. The test is intended for patients with symptoms suggestive of endometrial pathology.

#### 3. Will I receive the test results?

Patients will be contacted directly with their results and advised on next steps. If further action is needed in primary care, you will be informed accordingly.

# 4. Is this test replacing current diagnostic procedures?

No. The WID Easy Test is being piloted as an additional tool to support clinical decision-making. It may help reduce unnecessary invasive procedures and streamline pathways.
