# BOWEL CANCER SCREENING CAMPAIGN – 16<sup>TH</sup> OCTOBER 2023 - 3<sup>RD</sup> DECEMBER 2023

#### FOR INFORMATION

- As part of the NHS 'Help Us, Help You' campaign, a bowel screening campaign will be running from 16<sup>th</sup> October 2023 - 3<sup>rd</sup> December 2023.
- The campaign strategy to encourage participation in bowel screening will focus on:
  - Normalising the behaviour of completing the home test kit Inform our audience
    of the test kit's purpose and show lots of people like them are taking the test (to
    increase relevance) while removing the awkwardness; and
  - Addressing the barriers to taking action, including the inertia of this not being a priority, the misperception that screening is only for those that are experiencing symptoms or family history of bowel cancer, and concerns about efficacy that it is difficult and messy to complete the screening home test kit.
  - Removing the awkwardness of taking a poo sample with optimistic language, music and tone "your poo could save your life" encouraging enthusiasm towards the test;
  - Reducing the efficacy concerns by demonstrating that it is quick and easy to complete the test and only requires a 'tiny sample'; and
  - Addressing inertia through giving practical advice, with the endline: "put it by the loo, don't put it off"

The campaign will run across a range of avenues - TV, VOD, community radio, social media. The London campaign brief for bowel cancer screening includes a focus on the following multicultural audiences:

- Black African and Black Caribbean,
- Pakistani and Bangladeshi,
- Muslim (all groups)
- Eastern European (Polish and Romanian) and
- Orthodox Jewish

You may see an increase in patients asking about the Bowel Screening programme, or who may request a bowel cancer screening test. Patients should be encouraged to take up the screening offer, if in the eligible age cohort and can contact the Bowel Cancer Screening programme on 0800 707 60 60 to request a test.





# SUPPORTING PATIENTS COMPLETING FIT IF SYMPTOMATIC WEBINARS FOR PRIMARY CARE ADMINISTRATORS AND CLINICIANS

#### FOR INFORMATION

- A webinar discussing the role of FIT and how administrative staff can best support patients took place on 19 September.
- Produced by GatewayC and supported by TCST, NHS England and the Greater Manchester Cancer Alliance Early Diagnosis Team, the webinar was attended by over 160 people from across England. Primary care specialists discussed the role of the Faecal Immunochemical Test (FIT) in early cancer diagnosis, the difference between screening and symptomatic FIT, how administrative staff can best support patients to complete and return a FIT, why samples are rejected and safety netting guidance.
- There was also a Q&A session at the end for attendees to ask questions.

#### LONDON BREAST SCREENING COMMUNICATIONS TOOLKIT

#### FOR INFORMATION

- The London Region Breast Screening Recovery Programme at NHS England has produced a <u>London Breast Screening Communications Toolkit</u>, which sets out key messages on breast screening.
- It brings together a range of information and resources from various organisations to help inform health promotion and increase breast screening uptake across the region.
   The toolkit is designed for use by health and care colleagues and has been developed by breast screening services, cancer alliances and NHS England.
- Following the pandemic, routine breast screening has since resumed at all London breast screening units from September 2020, with services open and back to normal operational capacity. System partners are asked to encourage women to come forward and not delay when invited for their screening appointment.





# PAN LONDON CANCER ALLIANCES RESEARCH FELLOWSHIP

#### DEADLINE FOR SUBMISSION IS MONDAY 30<sup>TH</sup> OCTOBER 2023

- Now in its 8<sup>th</sup> year, the Pan-London Cancer Alliances Research Consortium is pleased to announce a new round of 12-month cancer research fellowships for 2023/24. We are now calling for potential supervisors to submit fellowship project proposals.
- The potential areas of focus for the projects are:
  - Earlier diagnosis: with a focus on access into primary care and/or diagnostics, or increasing uptake into cancer screening programmes from a population or place-based approach. Also including aspects of improving detection of recurrent cancer and/or surveillance strategies of the high risk.
  - **Cancer inequalities**: exploring variations in all aspects of cancer care throughout the patient journey, including screening, treatment and supportive care.
  - Personalised care of people living with and beyond cancer: optimisation of patient management during and after cancer treatment to improve quality of life and clinical outcomes, including multi-morbidity reviews and generation of evidence base for the cancer care reviews.
