# Grenfell Tower community update: November 2025

We recognise that Grenfell Tower has a deep personal significance to those most affected by the tragedy and that the land is sacred to families. We want to keep you updated on our work to carefully take down the Tower.

## **Illuminating the Tower**

We have heard it is important that there is a visible reminder of the Tower's presence while it is being carefully taken down. We have installed lighting so that beams of light will shine upwards at each corner of the Tower.

- From Sunday 14 December, they will shine every night from no earlier than 5pm, until 11pm.
- On 14 December and 14 June, we will switch on 72 beams of green light to mark these important dates in the year.
- We will test these lights for a short time on the evening of Saturday 13 December.

- The Grenfell heart banners will continue to stay lit up from dusk.

## **Installing new banners**

We are moving the Grenfell heart banners down the Tower as work progresses. In early January, we will add banners lower down the Tower. Once this has been added, we will remove the higher ones.

## **Monitoring information on noise, dust and vibration**

The government is committed to ensuring that all work at the Grenfell Tower site is carried out to the highest standards. The safety and wellbeing of the community and people working at the site remain our priority.

There are three vibration monitors at the Tower site and five air quality monitors, and three noise monitors around the site boundary, all collecting live data. Each month, we publish this data. To see the data for 29 September to 2 November, please click on the links below:

## **Christmas and New Year works schedule on the Grenfell Tower site**

- Friday 19 December, 8.30am to 12pm – normal working morning on the site
- Friday 19 December, 12pm to 5pm – work stops at 12pm and the site is then made ready for the Christmas and New Year break
- Monday 22 December to Sunday 4 January – no work taking place on site, apart from regular security and maintenance
- Monday 5 January, 8.30am to 5pm – work to carefully take down Grenfell Tower starts again after the Christmas and New Year break
