COMMUNITY CANCER AWARENESS GRANTS PROGRAMME

- RM Partners, North West and South West London Cancer Alliance are offering up to £500 to local community and voluntary groups, to hold activities and events that support local people to stay healthy and well. During these events we will be asking for messaging about cancer awareness to be shared and we will provide groups with all the resources they need to support with this, including online training delivered by Cancer Research UK.
- This programme is part of our plan to reduce the time it takes from when a person first notices a cancer sign or symptom to the time they see their GP.

 exercise classes, knitting workshops and more. All events or activities will need to take
 place between 15 July and 30 September 2024.

MULTI CANCER BLOOD TESTING (MCBT) PROGRAMME – GO LIVE NOW SCHEDULED OCTOBER 2024

 The NHS is conducting a large-scale in-service evaluation of a multi-cancer early detection blood test (the Galleri test).





- The Multi-Cancer Blood Test (MCBT) programme (previously known as the Galleri pilot) will offer up to 1 million multi-cancer early detection tests to asymptomatic people in select areas of England.
- It was originally proposed that the programme would commence from the summer of 2024 for a period of 2 years. The timetable for rollout of the programme has now changed with the programme commencing from October 2024.

BOWEL CANCER AWARENESS CAMPAIGN – BOWEL CANCER UK

- Bowel Cancer UK have launched a new campaign on potential symptoms of bowel cancer. The campaign, Tell Your GP Instead, is encouraging people experiencing key symptoms of possible bowel cancer to contact their GP to ask for an at-home test.
- The campaign is running until early 2025, reaching audiences via newspapers, radio, out
 of home sites (e.g. bus stops) and digital advertising. It is hoped that by getting the
 message into targeted communities, it will increase the number of people diagnosed at
 an earlier stage when bowel cancer is easier to treat.

PHYSICAL ACTIVITY IN CANCER CARE

- As part of our programme of work for 2024/2025, the RMP Personalised Care team is keen to ensure people living with and beyond cancer are aware of the benefits of physical activity, as well as the opportunities and support available to help them incorporate activity into their lifestyles.
- Our plan is to develop training, support and information to ensure staff feel confident to
 provide brief behaviour change interventions focusing on physical activity and health
 promotion at all points across the cancer pathway. We also want to offer awareness and
 promotion of physical activity opportunities across the alliance for people to utilise, for
 example, specific exercise classes or walking groups in community settings.

Our next steps include:

- Provision of a clinical staff survey to understand knowledge, attitudes and behaviour towards physical activity in cancer care
- Developing a training offer for clinical staff to increase knowledge and confidence to talk about physical activity and cancer
- Mapping of physical activity offers / services available across north west and south west London
