## Health Protection (Coronavirus, International Travel) (Wales) (Amendment) Regulations 2021

SI 2021/24: Amendments are made to the Health Protection (Coronavirus, International Travel) (Wales) Regulations 2020 (the "International Travel Regulations") which impose requirements on persons entering Wales after having been abroad. They include a requirement for persons arriving in Wales to isolate for a period determined in accordance with those Regulations. The requirement are subject to exceptions, and certain categories of person are exempt from having to comply in Wales. These Regulations came into force on at 4.00 am on 12 January 2021.

Members will be aware that the Welsh Government made provision in the Health Protection (Coronavirus, International Travel) (Wales) Regulations 2020 to ensure that travellers entering Wales from overseas countries and territories must isolate for 14 days and provide passenger information, to prevent the further spread of coronavirus. These restrictions came into force on 8 June 2020.
